Step 1: Make sure you are on track to graduate!

Each Senior will meet with their counselor individually to review their credits during the first quarter of school.



- You must have a 2.0 unweighted GPA
- Must pass Alg. 1 EOC and 10th Grade Reading FAST (or earn a concordant score on the Geometry EOC, PSAT, ACT, SAT, or CLT)
- Required Credits:
 - 4 Credits of English
 - 4 Credits of Math (Alg. 1, Geo., 2 more)
 - 3 Credits of Science (Bio., 2 more)
 - 3 Credits of Social Studies (WH, AH, Gov, and Econ.
 - 1 Credit of HOPE
 - 1 Credit of Performing Fine Art
 - 8 Elective Credits

Step 2: **Determining what** is next:

What is your plan for after high school? Military? Trade School? 2-year college? 4-Year **University?**

- Go to the TCHS Webpage, and click on C Open Clever
- Log into Clever using your "active directory" log-in (what you use for HAC)
- Click on the "Xello" Icon in your student applications and launch your dashboard!



Step 3: Take the next step and APPLY!

The **first step** in applying is deciding if you are applying "direct" or through "Common App"

The **second step** is going to the school website, click on "prospective students", read the information, and click "apply"

You will be asked to create an account. This is where **you will track** the required steps and make sure that they are completed.

If you apply through Common App, you will be asked to create a **college account** as well after you apply.

> Many of our state universities have application deadlines between October 15 and December 1st. Don't delay!

"Direct" is when you apply directly to the school you plan to attend. This is typically how you apply to state colleges, trade schools, or if you are only planning to apply to one university.

"Common App" is one application that allows you to apply to multiple schools at one time. This is best for students planning to apply to multiples universities.

Step 3 B: Create a Common App Account

Anyone who thinks they may be applying to multiple universities either in state or out of state should create an account (Some Universities do NOT use common app and will not appear when searched- they are direct apply)

- Use an email address you will have beyond graduation (personal email)
- Common App will require you have access to your high school transcript(HAC), a list of your activities, work, and family obligations, and test scores and dates, parent and guardian information, and academic honors and achievements.
- Most students including DE students will be a "first-year student" EVEN IF YOU GET YOUR AA degree coming out of HS
- Create a LOG IN that you will remember and write it down/place in notes
 on phone
- ADD Colleges
- WAIVE YOUR FERPA rights- we can't give information if you don't

Step 4: Sending the college your transcript if you applied "Direct"

Keep in mind that many of our state universities require a self report of your grades. Visit the "TCHS School Counseling" webpage and click on "transcripts" to see "how-to" videos for each school at the bottom of the page.

Step 4: Sending the college your transcript if you applied via "Common App"

First: Click on "plans" and select "College Applications" from the dropdown.



Once your accounts are connected, you should see your list of colleges in your Xello account.

Under the college, **select "assign**" next to the common app school report and select your school counselor.

Keep in mind that many of our state universities require a **self report** of your grades. Visit the "TCHS School Counseling" webpage and click on "transcripts" to see "how-to" videos for each school at the bottom of the page.

Second: Click on "Connect" to Connect your Common App to your Xello Account.



Connect Xello with your Common App account Sign in to Common App or create an account to sync your college applications. If you have multiple accounts, be sure to sync the account you used to create your applications.

Does your school require letters of recommendation?

Keep in mind that most state universities DO NOT require letters of recommendation and DO NOT want you to send them. If a letter of recommendation is required, you will see it in your "Xello Application Checklist"

Make sure that you talk to teachers that you are requesting a letter from! If your school requires letters of recommendation, follow these steps:

Step 2: Click on "College Applications" in the drop-down menu.

Step 3: Click "Request" from your "Application Checklist"

STEP 5: CHECK YOUR EMAIL DAILY!

- Develop habit of checking email DAILY!
- Create spreadsheet/Organization or use XELLO
- Make sure to slow down and assure you enter the correct information on all forms and applications
- Check your spam and junk folders
- Reach out to admissions office if you have a question
- Communicate regularly and KINDLY with your recommenders and Counselors- there is one of them and 600+ Seniors

Let's talk Bright Futures!

Application opens on October 1st. Step by step instructions to complete the application are available on the TCHS School Counseling page under "Bright Futures."



- Bright Futures Eligibility Criteria
 - GPA: 3.0 Weighted (Medallion), 3.5 Weighted (Academic). GPA only includes 16 core academic credits. <u>https://www-</u> tchs.stjohns.k12.fl.us/guidance/bright-futures/
 - **Community Service:** 75 Hours (Medallion), 100 (Academic). If using work, need 100 hours for both.
 - Test Scores:
 - Medallion Level: ACT: 25, CLT: 84, SAT: 1210,
 - Academic Level: ACT: 29, CLT: 96, SAT: 1340
 - Test scores MUST be sent to "A Florida State University" to count towards Bright Futures

Step 8: Let's talk! FAFSA®

- Application typically opens on October 1st. We are anticipating a December opening for the class of 2025.
- Families are encouraged to attend a "FAFSA Frenzy" event to get assistance completing their FAFSA. Events are advertised in the Bull Pen.

- Step 1: Create an account at studentaid.gov (top left corner)
- Step 2: Gather documents (parents SSN, Tax Returns, etc.)
- Step 3: Log in at fafsa.gov to apply online. Click "Start New Form" and enter your account username and password to get started.
- Step 4: List **at least one school** to receive your information and determine your financial aid package. (You can list up to 20!)
- Step 5: Assuming you are a dependent, you must list your parents' information.
- Step 6: Consent to automatically transfer your tax information to the FAFSA.
- Step 7: Sign and Submit
- Step 8: Watch your email for additional requests and information!
