Additionally, students should be made aware that there is a "residency" (amount of time/credit hours earned specifically on site at their institution/does not include courses transferred) required to receive a degree from a specific school

For community colleges it is estimated to be 18 credit hours

For 4 year colleges it is estimated to be 60 credit hours.
