### What's in a name?

#### Tocoi

The word "Tocoi" (pronounced "to-coy") originates from the Timucuan word for waterlily or shallow water. This word represents the name of the settlement region of Timucuan Indians on the St. Johns River in central St. Johns County and appears in early records around the year 1602. The Timucua settlement was described as "located on the St. Johns River more or less than five leagues due west of St. Augustine". 1 Records also indicate the river settlement served as a mission, school and important waypoint for residents and travelers moving throughout the area. The Timucua village of Tocoi proved to be a diverse crossroad for cultural exchange, education, and economic development for a growing region. 2

Throughout the Spanish and English settlement periods, Tocoi provided access for steamboat and rail commerce that was essential in the development of our nation's oldest city, St. Augustine. Like the Timucuan, Spanish and Minorcan residents continued to carve out a community from the wilderness to begin some of the earliest connections to our current industries and services.

Today, near the headwaters of Tocoi Creek and a few leagues north of the settlement of Tocoi on the St. Johns River lies the growing communities of the World Golf Village. A modern crossroads that represents the same focus on; community, diversity, commerce, education and possesses the same gritty spirit to develop a prosperous future for its residents.

#### Twila Needham Assistant Principal


