

Dear Toro Students, Parents and Guardians,

The end of week #7 brings upon a fun spirit filled Friday where all our fall sporting team members helped to “dance away” our week during the spirit activities this morning. In addition, I had the pleasure to tell our student a big announcement for TCHS. It is my pleasure to announce that our stadium will be ready for the Toros to have their first Homecoming ON CAMPUS! On October 29<sup>th</sup>, our students, dance, cheer, and football teams will all take the field against Melbourne Central Catholic High School as we begin OUR traditions on campus. Please read below for important updates:

- **PSAT** - The PSAT exam is an important upcoming assessment for high school students on Wednesday, October 13<sup>th</sup>. As a reminder, the PSAT is for ALL 10<sup>th</sup> grade students as well as 9<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade students who have registered and paid to take the exam.
  - Due to COVID-19, the number of students we can place in our large group spaces is significantly reduced. This makes it difficult to provide a learning space for students who are not participating in the PSAT. To ensure both student safety and the optimal testing environment, we will allow flexibility to students on this day. High school students who are not participating in the PSAT may complete assigned work from home or at school on this day. Assigned work will be due on Thursday, October 14<sup>th</sup>.
- **IDs in the Cafeteria** - As on Monday, October 4<sup>th</sup>, all students must have their IDs to purchase school lunch. Students will no longer be able to punch in their student numbers to make a purchase. This is in effort to speed up our lunch lines and provide additional security for our student lunch accounts. We encourage all students to follow the attached directions to download their free digital ID. If students do not have their phones, they may use their printed ID. If students do not have a printed ID, they may visit one of Swipe Kiosks in the classroom building or front office to quickly print a temporary ID.

  - **Dismissal at Lunch-** If you need to check your child out during their lunch time please be patient. You are welcome to text your student upon arrival to the school to help speed up the process. Please know that you will still need to come into the school to sign out your child and show proper identification.

**Attendance** - We are excited to share that our TCHS Attendance Page is now available on our website. This page will allow you to upload all early dismissal and absentee information digitally, including doctor's notes, so there is no need to turn in any documents to the front office due to an absence. **Tardies** – Students who are late to school (not in 1<sup>st</sup> period by 9:20am), or in their scheduled classroom after the warning bell and class start signal, then they are to report to offices in Bld 1 (first floor) and Bld 4 (first, second and third floor) tardy kiosks where they enter their student ID or scan their digital/hard ID to receive a tardy slip to class, this tardy will automatically be uploaded to HAC attendance.

**Lockers and Textbooks** – If your Toro did not select a locker yet, please have them report to the Deans Office with their selections.

## **FSA and EOC Scores**

## [HAC Test Scores Quick Start Guide](#)

As we received the state assessment data late in the summer, we had to delay the final report card for the 2020-2021 school year and the availability of FSA / EOC scores for parents. All scores are now available for parents through the Home Access Center (HAC) by logging onto the SJCS D website and clicking on the HAC icon at the top right side of the webpage. The scores are sorted by name and then test date so for many students, the most recent FSA scores are in the middle of the screen. Attached is a quick start guide for reference and assistance. At this point all spring assessment results that we've received from the FLDOE have been entered into HAC/Student Test History, including; FSA ELA, FSA Math, EOC (Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, Civics, US History), FSAA, & Grades 5/8 science. i-Ready has also been loaded into the system Your school will communicate with you when hard copies of the test scores are available. We are so proud of the hard work done by students, teachers, and parents and the flexibility and patience shown by all last year. These scores will also be used to determine school grades for last year.

## **TCHS Café News**

### ***What qualifies as a free lunch?***

- \* You must choose 3 components of the five food groups- Protein, Grain, Fruit, Vegetable, Dairy- to qualify for a free lunch
- \* One of the choices must be a fruit or a vegetable
- \* We have 100% fruit Juice boxes that can be a fruit substitute if desired to compose a free lunch
- \* Milk or chocolate milk is the only item considered a Dairy and can be used as a component but is not required to qualify for a free lunch.
- \* The only outside vendor that qualifies as a free lunch component is one slice of papa John's pizza, slices after the first will be charged a-la-cart
- \* There are Posters posted on the wall behind the serving line that instruct students to choose three components
- \* On the serving line we will post a daily menu with options and examples of free lunch availability each day until we attain some stability with our supply chain and can solidify a set menu.
- \* Each day we will offer multiple hot and cold entrée items as well as multiple rotating fruit and veggie options to choose from

\*You must choose three components of the five food groups- Protein, Grain, Fruit, Vegetable, Dairy- At least one component must be a fruit or vegetable.

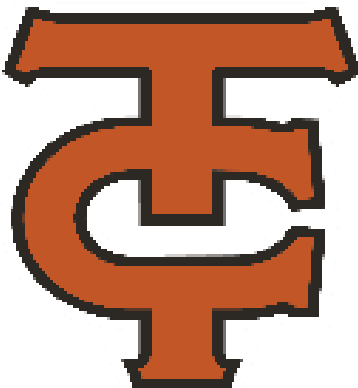
\*Two of the small Fruit or Veggie Cups equal one Component

## School and District COVID Protocols

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The DOH has adjusted the student quarantine guidelines as of yesterday. There has been information sent out via the news stations but I wanted to communicate it clearly to you so that you understand your choices if you are notified that your child is a close contact of a positive COVID individual.

On 9/22/2021, the Department of Health has updated their emergency rule (64DER21-15) to include student quarantines.

1. *Student quarantines: (3)(a) Parents or legal guardians of students who are known to have been in direct contact with an individual who received a positive diagnostic test for COVID-19 **may choose one of the following options:***
  - a. *Allow the student to attend school, school-sponsored activities, or be on school property, without restrictions or disparate treatment, so long as the student remains asymptomatic; or*
  - b. *Quarantine the student for a period of time not to exceed seven days from the date of last direct contact with an individual that is positive for COVID-19.*

**Based on this new ruling, you have a choice whether to quarantine your child or not, if they have no symptoms.** Below is the new email communication that you will receive notifying you of your choices if your child is a close contact:

*We have been advised that your child, [student name], has potentially been exposed to a COVID-19 positive individual on [exposure date]. In accordance with the FL DOH Emergency Rule, you may choose to keep your child home to quarantine for a period of time not to exceed seven days. Your child does not need to seek COVID-19 testing or produce a negative test result to return to school tomorrow if he/she is without any symptoms.*

*If you choose to keep your child home to quarantine, please call the District COVID Support Team at 904-547-8230 to report your child on quarantine.*

*If you have health-related quarantine questions, we have set up a quarantine call line at 904-819-1101.*

**To be clear**, if your child has NO symptoms and is on quarantine, they may return to school if you choose. This begins today. If you choose to quarantine, you need to contact the District COVID support team and report that you are opting to quarantine your child. This also begins today.

Due to this change in policy, it is more important than ever to monitor your child for symptoms and keep them home if they are not well. We want students to be in school learning and we also want children healthy and safe. We are in this together and will continue to work together to navigate this new normal.
