Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (F.A.S.T)

The new state reading & writing exam for grades 3-10, Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (F.A.S.T) is replacing the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA). FAST requires students to be progress monitored 2 times before the May administration. The first round of progress monitoring for 9th and 10th graders will start on Thursday, September 8th. The exam is computer-based and is 60 minutes in length. All FAST progress monitoring will occur through English classes.

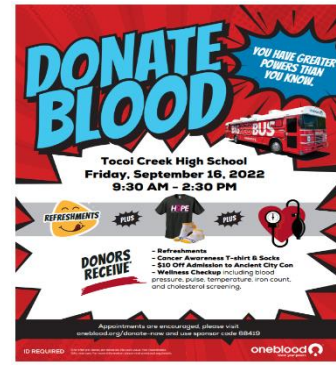

TESTING INFORMATION

SAT-NCR (Non-College Reportable) Exam – 12th Gr ONLY Oct 12th

Cost: \$60

This test is for 12th grade students who have not met the FSA Grade 10 ELA and/or the Algebra 1 EOC graduation requirement. Students who participate in this SAT-NCR experience will be granted accommodations (i.e., extended time) in hopes that the extra time will give the student a better chance to acquire the necessary SAT English and Reading (EBRW) score of 480 to meet the FSA Grade 10 ELA graduation requirement and/or SAT Math score of 420 to meet the Algebra 1 EOC graduation requirement. However, because these accommodations are not officially approved by College Board, results earned during a non-college reportable SAT administration cannot be used for admissions or scholarship purposes.

The SAT-NCR will be offered at Toco Creek on Wednesday, October 12, 2022 to 12th Graders ONLY. The cost of the SAT-NCR exam is \$60.00. Payment can be made via this link in School Pay. Payment is due by Friday, September 9, 2022.

PSAT - Date: October 12th – All 10th Grade and Registered 9th and 11th

The PSAT exam is an important upcoming assessment for high school students on Wednesday, October 12th, 2022. As a reminder, the PSAT is for ALL 10th grade students as well as any 9th or 11th grade students who register and pay to take the exam.

The purpose of the test is to give all students an opportunity to experience taking a college readiness test and to identify students who might benefit from advanced coursework.

Students in 9th and 11th grade must pay a \$22 registration fee to take the test and receive their scores. **REGISTRATION CLOSES ON SEPTEMBER 9TH AT 11:59P.M.**

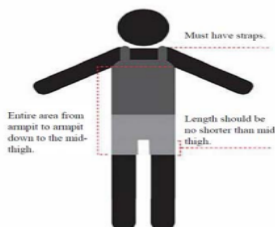
General School Information

Parent should not delay applying to prevent a gap in their student's meal eligibility.

Dress Code – TCHS will follow the [St. Johns County School District Code of Student Conduct](#) for appropriate dress while at school.

- Personal attire may be in the style of the day. Clothing, piercings and accessories displaying profanity, violence, discriminatory messages, sexually suggestive phrases, phrases or symbols of alcohol, tobacco or drugs is unacceptable.
- Gang graffiti will not be drawn or worn on backpacks, notebooks, folders, papers, clothing or any other object or on the body of any student or person on school property.
- Pajamas shall not be worn as exterior clothing on campus.
- Head gear, including but not limited to, caps, hats, bandanas and/or sunglasses shall not be worn indoors on campus unless permitted by school administration for religious or medical reasons. Students may wear sunglasses, hats, or other sun-protective wear while outdoors during school hours.
- Clothing must cover areas from one armpit to the other armpit, down to the mid-thigh. Tops must have shoulder straps and be long enough to adequately cover the waistline and not expose the midriff.



- Students must wear shoes that are safe and appropriate for the learning environment. Middle school and elementary school students must wear shoes that have a back or strap on the heel. High school students may wear backless shoes. Bedroom slippers are prohibited.
- See-through or mesh garments must be worn with opaque clothing over it or underneath that meets the standard for clothing coverage.
- Rips or tears in clothing above the mid-thigh must not expose skin.
- Any student who attends First Coast Technical College must follow dress code regulations established by each occupational department of FCTC (i.e., safety clothing, protective garments, and business attire).

PE Uniforms - PE Uniforms are for sale for the 2022-2023 school year. If your student is enrolled in any PE class, including hope, they are required to dress out in approved PE gear and wear athletic shoes each day. Students are permitted to wear the approved PE uniform, any TCHS sports package gear, or a school appropriate shirt with black shorts.
