Certification Testing Updates

TCHS is an authorized testing center for Certiport. This allows us to test students for their industry certification exams right here on campus. Certiport's process for allowing the school to request IEP and 504 accommodations requires parents to sign two consent forms.

Accommodation request paperwork will be sent home with students with 504s and IEPs on November 15th. Please return this paperwork no later than November 22nd so that it can be processed by Certiport in time for Spring testing.

Certiport exams include those exams given in: Digital Video Tech levels 1-4, Digital Art levels 1-2, Academy of Innovation in the Built Environment, Academy of Leadership in Emerging Tech (level 2 only).

- November 10th: students in Digital Video Tech Levels 2,3, & 4 will be allowed to retake Adobe Premiere Pro if they did not pass this test last year.
- November 15th: students in year 2 of the Academy of Innovation in the Built Environment will be allowed to retake their AutoCAD exam if they did not pass the test last year






FLAGLER HEALTH + ACADEMY OF FUTURE HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS




STUDENT SHOUT-OUT

Academy students must keep their Academy course semester grade at a 70% or higher. If a student's semester grade is not at least a 70%, a letter will be sent home informing the student and their parent that they are on Academy Academic Probation for the following semester. Students must earn at least a 70% or higher for the following semester to remain in the Academy. If the student earns a grade lower than a 70% for two semesters in a row, that student is released from the Career Academy and cannot re-enroll at any time. If a student needs any academic help, they can get FREE tutoring in any subject from the National Honor Society.
