

Advanced Placement Parents/Guardians and Students,

Below is a **FAQ** that you should review before May 2026 to be fully prepared.

Q: What time should I (my child) show up for an exam.

A:

For Morning Testing: **Students should arrive for their exam at 7:30 am**

Students with a 7:30am arrival will arrive at Gate A (main entry gate by the car line) to enter campus and walk to testing location.

For Afternoon Testing: **Students should arrive for their exam at 11:30am**

- *The exams will start promptly at 8:00 AM and 12:00 PM. Hence the early arrive.*

- *Late students will NOT be allowed to test.*

- *“No shows” will have a College Board fee of \$40 placed on their TCHS debt list.*

Q: What should I (my child) bring to the exam?

A: See below:

- USERNAME & PASSWORD for AP Classroom to login to BLUEBOOK; this is critical. You will NOT be able to test without it. ONLY your child has access to this info.
- A snack, water, Pens/Pencils. **In a labeled clear zip lock bag.**
- AP ID Labels for Hybrid Exams
- Calculators depending on exam- see policy [here](#)

That is ALL!

- *Bags, books, phones etc. should be left in cars, or lockers, or not brought AT ALL.*
- If there is NO way to leave a phone it MUST be OFF in the clear zip lock bag with student name on it. **If a student’s phone goes off or if a student is EVER seen touching their phone at any time once directions are read their test will be invalidated.** If we don’t invalidate, we could jeopardize our ability at Tocoi Creek to offer AP courses and exams. Please talk with your child about this. We will have a ZERO tolerance policy on phones. Additionally, students will be required to turn in all smart watches worn into the exam.

Q: Where on campus is my (my child’s) test?

A: Please access the calendar with locations on the TCHS website under Testing

Q: Is there a dress code?

A: Students MUST be in dress code, or they will not be allowed to test. Please also remember it can get cold in the GYM/ Computer Labs. We suggest layering.

Q: I (my child) is/am a senior. I want to leave after my morning AP exam.

A: Please complete the form sent out for parent permission to check out early. Seniors ONLY.

Q: I (my child) is /am an underclassman. Can they leave early/ come late?

A: Underclassmen are expected to report to all classes while not in an AP exam.

Q: When is the late exam?

A: If you need a late exam, you must communicate with AP Coordinator and Assistant Principal, Stacey Johnson if this is needed prior to missing the exam. There is a \$40 fee. Late exams are NOT guaranteed, depending on the subject, and are not scheduled for additional studying time.

A: You will be given a \$40 unused exam fee on your student debt list
